



Botanical name:

*Geijera parvifolia*

Common name:

Wilga, Australian Willow, Sheep Bush

Origin:

Dry inland areas in NSW, Qld, Vic & SA.

Typical height:

7-12 metres

Typical width:

6-11 metres

Growth rate:

Slow to Moderate

Typical form:

Small to medium sized evergreen broad-domed tree.

Characteristics:

Elegant, leathery, linear foliage. Ascending structural branches with pendulous smaller branches and foliage. White, strongly-scented flowers.

Site requirements:

Species adaptable to a wide range of climatic and soil conditions. Full sun to part shade.

Tolerances:

High drought and frost tolerance.

Notes:

Little pruning required, crown lifting. Difficult to propagate with irregular availability of stock.
