Typical height:

15-20 metres

Typical width:

Growth rate:

Moderate

Typical form:

Large broad domed deciduous tree



Characteristics:

Oval or oblong, lobed leaves. Attractive, ridged bark. Flowers inconspicuous

Site requirements:

Adapts to most soil textures, prefers well drained

Tolerances:

High drought and frost tolerance. Low water logging tolerance.



Notes:

Needs some pruning to develop strong structure.
